



SERMON TITLE: "Unconditionally Loved"

PRIMARY SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:18-39

Summary: God's love for us is not a reward for our achievements or good behavior. It is a constant gift based on His character. Because of Jesus, we are invited into a relationship where we are fully known and fully accepted.

THE BIG IDEA: Jesus did for us what we could never do for ourselves. Because of His victory, we are safe, valued, and loved forever.

1. **Jesus Won the Battle for Us:** Just as a pioneer clears a path for others, Jesus broke the barrier between God and humanity so we can walk freely with Him.
2. **We Have Real Hope and Help:** We have a promise of a future home in heaven and the Holy Spirit to help us with our weaknesses right now.
3. **God is Always on Our Side:** Because the Creator of the universe is for us, no critic, failure, or enemy can truly defeat us.

Section 1: Getting Started (Icebreaker)

Reflective Question: If you knew with 100% certainty that you were completely loved and could not fail, how would that change the way you face your biggest challenge this week?

1. Observation (What does the Bible say?):

- a. How does Paul describe our current troubles compared to the "glory" that is coming? (Romans 8:18)
- b. In what specific way does the Holy Spirit help us when we are at our weakest? (Romans 8:26)
- c. What "big question" does Paul ask to show that believers are secure? (Romans 8:31)

Section 2: Digging Deeper (Learning More)

2. Interpretation (What does it mean?):

- a. The Bible says God gives us "right standing." This is like a judge wiping your record clean because someone else paid your fine. How does this change how you see your "guilty" days? (Romans 8:33-34)
- b. Scripture says God "works together" all things. Why is it important to notice it doesn't say all things *are* good,

but that God *uses* them for good? (Romans 8:28)

- c. Look at the list provided in the text (death, life, angels, fears, worries). Why do you think Paul used such "extreme" examples to describe God's love? (Romans 8:38-39)
- d. How does God's promise to give us a future and a hope help us stay patient during hard times? (Jeremiah 29:11)
- e. Since we were "bought with a price," how does knowing we belong to God change the way we value ourselves? (1 Corinthians 6:20)

Section 3: Let's Get Practical (My Life)

3. Application (How does it change me?):

- a. Of the four benefits listed above (Future Hope, Daily Help, God is for you, or Unconditional Love), which one is hardest for you to believe right now?
- b. Knowing that Jesus did the "heavy lifting" for you, what is one small way you can live for Him this week out of gratitude instead of duty?

Challenge of the Week:

Identify one "worry for tomorrow" that has been weighing you down. Hand that worry over to God in prayer, specifically thanking Him that this situation cannot separate you from His love.

Closing Prayer:

"Father, thank You that my value is found in You and not in my work. Thank You for the victory Jesus won on my behalf. Help me walk this week in the confidence that I am Your child, I am forgiven, and I am unconditionally loved. Amen."
